Hispanic students involved in public service activities are encouraged to apply for these scholarships, which offer financial aid for associate, bachelor's, and graduate degrees. U.S. citizens, lawful permanent residents, and individuals seeking consideration under the DACA (Deferred Action for Childhood Arrival) policy are eligible for these scholarships.

Latino students who are U.S. citizens or permanent residents, along with African American, American Indian, Alaska Native, Asian American, and Pacific Islander students, are eligible for these scholarships, which cover all or most of the costs of a college education at any accredited institution of higher education in the U.S. Applicants must also be eligible for the federal Pell Grant.
